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Clinical Trials Confirm Enlarge Prostate Can Be Shrunk Naturally with Dr **Allen Devices**

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The single most common prostate problem arising in men is enlarged prostrate. Medically known as benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH), it's estimated that almost all men will develop some type of enlargement of the prostate as they grow older.

Statistics show that by the age of 60 and estimated 50% of men will show symptoms of enlarged prostrate. By the age of 90, the number of men showing signs of the condition jumps to 90%.

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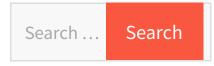
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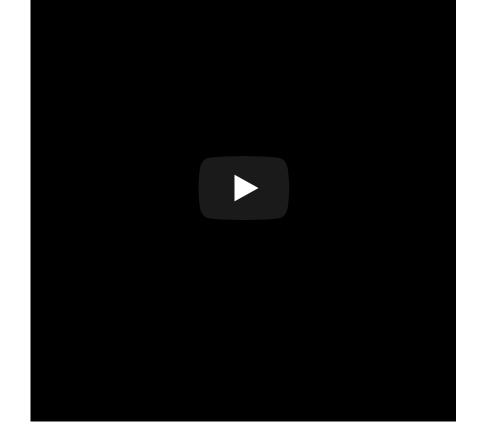
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Common treatments for BPH can include medications designed to shrink the size of the prostate gland or to inhibit testosterone conversion into a type of hormone that may affect growth of the prostate gland. Invasive surgical procedures to completely remove any prostate tissue that blocks flow of urine were also used to treat some men.

However, clinical trials into Dr. Allen's Device and Thermobalancing therapy conclude that more natural forms of treatment may be available. Removing the need for medications or surgery using natural alternative that are more effective and less invasive reduces the risk of adverse side effects or of developing other health complications.

Prior to formal clinical trials being conducted, the Dr. Allen's Thermobalancing therapy device was trialed and monitored online by Dr. Simon Allen, MD, PhD himself.

Dr. Allen, the Director of Fine Treatment, says "I graduated from the medical University in 1972 and completed by PhD study in 1978. For over 14 years, I worked at and subsequently headed a hospital's cardio-vascular department, and



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treated patients with metabolic disorders, including those linked to obesity, kidneys, arthritis, cardio-vascular and gastroenterological diseases. I lectured medical doctors pursuing higher medical qualifications. Then I devoted nearly two decades to further medical research into various chronic diseases and developed Thermobalancing therapy and Dr. Allen's Device."

The initial results of the informal trial were sufficient to support the positive effects that Thermobalancing therapy produced.

Dr. Allen's therapeutic device is essentially an elastic belt containing a wax-based thermoelement, which must be firmly applied to the coccyx area for a period of time. The body's own heat acts as a natural heat source for the thermoelement, creating the effect of Thermobalancing therapy. The deceptively simple design makes it easy for men with symptoms of BPH to use without the need for medications.

Dr Allen Devices Fine Treatment

Encouraged by the positive results of the first trials, a formal clinical study into the efficacy of Dr. Allen's Devices for treating enlarged prostate was conducted by Professor Ivan Aghajanyan, Member of the Academy of Medical Sciences and Head of the Department of Urology at the Mikaelyan Institute of Surgery in Armenia.

The formal clinical study concluded that treatment using Dr. Allen's Device and Thermobalancing therapy produced a distinct reversal in the size of an enlarged prostate naturally in almost all men participating in the trial.

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The symptoms associated with enlarged

prostate can include:

- Difficulty beginning to urinate
- Slow urinary stream
- Frequent need to urinate, including throughout the night

As the prostate enlarges further, symptoms may progress to the point of developing a range of more serious conditions, including:

- Blood in the urine
- Bladder infection
- Kidney impairment
- Blocked urinary tube

Prior to Dr. Allen's device and the invention of Thermobalancing therapy, common treatments for enlarged prostate often included medications that were linked to an increased risk of a rare, but particularly aggressive form of prostate cancer. Professor Traish from Boston University School of Medicine investigated some of the drugs commonly used to treat BPH, including Proscar (Finasteride) and Avodart (Dutsteride). The study concluded that long-term use of BPH medications had a negative impact in men's overall health, with strong links to an increased risk of heart attack, developing diabetes, and other life-long complications.

In an interview with Panorama AM, Professor Aghajanyan said "I welcome Dr. Allen's invention that can help many men to avoid any surgical intervention on the prostate and kidneys, and refrain from taking medications linked to potential complications."
